Dear Friends:







Come Fly With Us

The "Come Fly With Us" contest has become an annual event in Deptford Township to commemorate the landing of the first manned balloon flight in our country's history.

Students in Pre-K, kindergarten and 1st grade are asked to color a balloon picture, while students in grades 2 - 6th are asked to submit a drawing that best represents the "Come Fly With Us" theme. Students in grades 7 - 12th are asked to submit an essay that best describes what the "Come Fly With Us" theme represents.

DEPTFORD TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS

BRANCH/LOG COLLECTION

- For removal of branches and logs please call the Public Works Office 856-228-4719 or go to the Online request form.
- Branches should be cut into 5 foot sections and be neatly placed at the curb line. Logs should be cut into 2 foot sections and be placed neatly at the curb line. Tree roots and stumps must be free of dirt and cut into 2 foot sections for easy handling. This service is not available to Builders or Contractors. Please be advised that lot clearing is the responsibility of the Property Owner and will not be collected by the Public Works Department.

E-WASTE COLLECTION

We now recycle TV's at the Public Works Facility. TV's must be intact TV's that are not intact will not be accepted. Items accepted are: TV's, ,towers, desktops, laptops, all computers & accessories, printers, fax machines, cell phones, VCR's, DVD's, CD players.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

- Fall Leaf collection begins Nov 2nd and ends Jan 11th. Please remember to keep leaves away from vehicles and not to park on leaf pile so leaf machines will have easy access to the leaves. Leaves must be placed at the curb free of any rocks, branches, twigs, dirt, pet waste, horse manure or other debris in order for them to be vacuumed up easily and not cause damage to machines. Leaves not put to the curb for pickup during this scheduled leaf pickup will have to wait until the beginning of the Spring Clean Up Program or our Yard Waste Program to be picked up.
- Please note that our Yard Waste Pick up program runs all year. Yard Waste debris such as grass, flowers, plants, small limbs and leaves are required to be placed in containers or biodegradable paper bags no heavier then 50lbs at the curb for pick up. Please be patient, the schedule is subject to change due to weather conditions.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

This should be taken to The Gloucester County Solid Waste Complex on special waste days. Please call 856-478-6045 for special collection dates.

RECYCLING

- Corrugated Cardboard- Large cardboard boxes must be cut down or flattened in order to be placed in tote. If you have excessive amounts of cardboard you must flatten, bundle and place at the curb for Friday pickup and call the Public Works Department to have a work order placed for pickup. Cut up large pieces of cardboard so they will fit inside the container easily.
- **Mixed Paper** Mail, magazines, office and colored paper, regular and window envelopes, receipts, glossy inserts, telephone books, chipboard and paperback books, greeting cards, brown craft paper bags, and non metallic wrapping paper.
- Glass Bottles & Jars- Clear, green and brown bottles and jars. Rinse out bottles and jars and place in tote.
- Aluminum, Steel & Tin Cans- Beverage and food cans. Rinse cans and place in tote.
- Plastic Containers Only- Beverage and laundry containers with #1 PETE and #2 HDPE symbols (located on the bottom or side of the container) Rinse out containers.
- Items that **Will Not be recycled** under this program are toys, plastic bags, bubble wrap, ovenware, ceramic and polystyrene cups and plates, Styrofoam, pots and pans, baking pans,

drinking glasses, mirrors, automobile windshields, light bulbs, window glass, wax coated boxes, pizza boxes, 6-pack beverage holders, flower pots, plastic bags, comforters, pillows, rugs and all other miscellaneous plastics. All these items must be placed I household trash.

- Place the Toter at curbside no earlier than 6pm the night before your scheduled pick up and no later than 6am. The day of your scheduled pickup. Toters must not be placed behind cars, mailboxes, telephone poles or any obstruction that will make it difficult for the operator to pick it up.
- Do not place inside the Toter: Trash/ Grass/ Wood/ Dirt/ Paint cans/ Hazardous chemicals Styrofoam, vinyl or any other materials that are not part of the Deptford Township's Recycling Program. If you have any questions please call 856-228-4719 between 7:30am. 3:30pm.

TRASH COLLECTION

All household trash must be placed in a container or bag in a convenient place visible from the street for collection. Recycling Material will still be collected on your regularly scheduled trash day.-Hours and Days of Collection Gold Metal Inc. will collect residential refuse and recycling material from all residential homes within the Township, Monday through Thursday of each week. Refuse service shall be between the hours of 7:00AM and 7:00PM. It shall be the responsibility of the residents to place refuse at the proper location at or before 6:00AM on a regularly scheduled collection day.

- Items **NOT ALLOWED** in Trash Pick-up: concrete, dirt, bricks, batteries, railroad ties, rocks, tires, logs, stumps, etc will not be collected by Gold Metal Inc. Contractor/construction debris and scrap building materials must be removed by the company performing the work. If minor repair work is completed by the resident, small amounts of materials will be collected provided it meets general guidelines regarding lengths, weights, etc; Such amounts should be cut to four (4') feet in length tied and bundled and not exceed fifty (50) pounds in weight.
- Holidays: Prior to each holiday the collection schedule will be advertised in the local paper. Your trash and recycling will be collected on the following business day.

SNOW REMOVAL - RESIDENTS are REMINDED to KEEP CARS OFF SNOW COVERED STREETS in ACCORDANCE with TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE No. 0.1.01

It is extremely important to keep parked cars off the streets during snow storms. Your cooperation will enable Township crews to clear the snow adequately from the streets. Snow storms can be stressful for everyone. Please be patient to allow our crews to effectively and safely complete snow removal. The Township of Deptford needs the help of its citizens to efficiently remove snow and ice from the roadways. The main roadways (those that carry the most traffic) are given first priority for salting and plowing. During a heavy snowfall, concentration is placed on the main roadways until they are cleared at which time the secondary roads are attended to. Cul-de-sacs, or circles, are the last to be plowed.

• Cul-de-sacs are among the most difficult streets to plow and require the greatest amount of time. The Public Works department prefers to push the snow off the road leaving the cul-de-sac free from snow piles that could melt and cause icing conditions. This greatly reduces hazardous conditions and prevents pot holes from forming. Cars parked on the street become a major problem during inclement winter weather. As the plow goes around the parked vehicles, it leaves piles of snow on the roadway. To avoid this, please remove vehicles from the street during snowstorms, in accordance with Township Ordinance. Please do not throw snow into the street from your sidewalk and driveway.

SPRING CLEAN UP

• Spring clean up is only for the month of April. Please have leaves curbside before the first designated collections date which will be online or in the newsletter as this will ensure prompt service. Please keep branches separate and call Public Works for pick up.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

- Water from rain and melting snow that flows over lawns, parking lots and streets is known as stormwater runoff. This water, which travels along gutters, into catch basins and through storm drain pipes and ditches, usually is not treated, but then flows or is discharged into local waterbodies. Along the way, the stormwater picks up trash (fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, Styrofoam cups, etc.) and toxins and other pollutants (gas, motor oil, antifreeze, fertilizers, pesticides and pet droppings). This polluted stormwater can kill fish and other wildlife, destroy wildlife habitat, contaminate drinking water sources and force the closing of beaches because of health threats to swimmers.
- Human activity is largely responsible for the stormwater pollution. Everything that we put on the ground or into the storm drain can end up in our water. Each of us has a responsibility to make sure these contaminants stay out of our water. Whether we have clean water is up to you.

TRANSPORTATION-SENIOR BUS SCHEDULE SERVICE

- Monday through Friday Route 1: Runs to Acme, ShopRite, Deptford Mall, and the Dollar Store. Tuesday and Thursday Route 2: Runs twice a week to ShopRite, Deptford Mall, and K-Mart

YARD WASTE PROGRAM

- Deptford Township's yard waste program will be collected between March 1st through October 31st. Residents can place their leaves, grass clippings, sticks, twigs, and garden clippings in a container no larger than 30 gallons and which must not exceed 50lbs in weight.
- Yard waste will be picked up the day after your regularly scheduled trash collection day from March 1st to October 31st.
- Dirt, rocks, sod and dog waste will not be accepted in yard waste containers. Do not commingle yard waste with trash.

MUNICIPAL BUILDING

The Deptford Township Municipal Building is located at 1011 Cooper Street, Deptford, NJ. Regular working hours are 8:30AM to 4:30PM Monday through Friday. Main Phone Number (856) 845-5300

VOTER REGISTRATION

Anyone who is 18 years of age or older, a citizen of the United States and a resident of New Jersey at least 30 days prior to Election Day may register to vote. Vote by Mail applications are available in the Clerk's Office or online at www.deptford-nj.org. Polling locations are also listed on our website.

CONSTRUCTION PERMITS

All Construction/Zoning permits must be obtained for new construction, additions and certain alterations (including heaters, roofs, siding, sheds, concrete, fences, etc.) Permit applications may be obtained from the Construction Office in the Municipal Building or online at www.deptford-nj.org. All permits require inspections. Inspections must be called into the Construction Office at (856) 845-5300.

RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTIES/LANDLORD REGISTRATION

As per Deptford Township Ordinance, all residential rental properties are required to be registered annually. For information contact the Landlord Registration Department at (856) 686-2216.

DOG LICENSES

Dogs must be licensed each year during January. Licenses may be obtained at the Municipal Building. Proof of rabies inoculation is required before a license is issued. For more information contact (856) 845-5300 ext. 2260.

HEALTH & VITAL STATISTICS

The Office of Vital Statistics contains all vital records (births, deaths and marriages) that have occurred within the Township of Deptford dating back to 1915. Certified copies of birth, death and marriage, domestic partners and civil unions certificates that have occurred within the Township of Deptford are available at the Deptford Township Registrars Office in the Municipal Building located at 1011 Cooper Street for a fee of \$25.00 for the first copy. Additional copies can be purchased for \$2.00.

TAX COLLECTION

Taxes are due and payable on the 1st day of February, May, August and November. Deptford Township allows a ten day grace period, if payment made after the grace period, interest starts to accrue back to the 1st day of the due date month.
