#### TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS WORKING TO IMPROVE SCHOOL SAFETY

Nationally, recent tragic events in Uvalde, Texas along with other areas have underscored the need to ensure a coordinated approach to ensuring the safety of our children and school personnel. The best approach is

for local police and school officials to identify potentials for violence before they occur.

The Deptford Police Department is working closely with school officials by advising them of any juvenile arrests which occur outside of school. School officials along with law enforcement can assess this information in order to ensure no conflicts arise with students which could endanger the school environment. Township schools hold regular safety drills to continuously assess and upgrade safety procedures.

Recently, Governor Phil Murphy signed legislation requiring school districts to develop and adopt a policy for the establishment of a threat assessment team at their respective schools.

Threat assessment teams provide school teachers,

administrators, and other staff with assistance in identifying students of concern, assessing those students' risk for engaging in violence or other harmful activities, and delivering intervention strategies to manage the

risk of harm for students who pose a potential safety risk to prevent targeted violence in the school.

Schools will utilize counselors, teachers, administrators, school safety specialist and law enforcement liaisons on their threat assessment team. These efforts will strengthen and contribute to making our schools safer throughout the Township.





#### 9 P.M. ROUTINE

The 9 P.M. Routine is a daily reminder to lock your vehicle, remove all valuables, lock all doors and windows to your home, and turn on an exterior light. The goal is to reduce preventable crimes. Periodically there is a social media post reminding residents about the 9 P.M. Routine. This is a simple prevention tip that reminds residents to secure their valuables by encouraging them to conduct a security check of their home and vehicles.

#### PARKING YOUR VEHICLE DURING A WINTER STORM

Deptford Township Police and Public Works would like to remind that you that when snow has fallen and covers the public road, street or highway parking any vehicles, trailer or other type of obstruction on any portion of the public road, street or highway is prohibited. The parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased and until the streets, roads or highways have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic. Any unoccupied vehicle that is in violation may be removed by the Deptford Township Police and the owner shall pay reasonable costs of storage and towing.

#### **SPEEDING AWARENESS**

Deptford Township Mayor & Council want to make you aware of our Speeding Awareness Program. They are working with our Police and Community to reduce speeding and make people aware of the danger speeding vehicles create.

We hope you have seen our "No Need to Speed" signs throughout the town. These signs are a part of our program to remind travelers to slow down in Deptford Township. Speeding vehicles are a serious danger and also a financial burden to you. Our Police do all they can to curb this problem, however, it is up to all of us to watch our speedometers and slow down!

Police enforcement and tickets are one of the solutions but the problem never goes away unless we educate the



danger and make people realize that wherever they are going they will get to their destination no quicker by speeding. A tip for travelers is leave enough time to get to work or do errands and let's protect our children and neighbors. Drive Safely!



Deptford Township flies the American Flag every day of the year. The U.S. flag stands for our nation and the shared history, pride, principles and commitment of its people. When we properly display this powerful symbol, we signal our respect for everything it represents.

Township council has embarked on a program to display the American

Flag on 50 ft. flag poles at every one of our public buildings. Just recently we had a new flag pole installed at the Mall center island. We installed new flag poles at the Recreation Center, the Deptford Public Works building, the Deptford Community Center, a new American Flag on Delsea Drive at Tacoma Boulevard and 24 new 15 foot flag poles at our Veterans Park in Oak Valley. The flag is our symbol of freedom and sacrifice. The

red and white stripes represent the original 13 colonies. The 50 white stars on a blue field represent the 50 states. The only dignitaries who can order a flag to half-staff is the President or the Governor of the State.

We have a flag disposal box in the lobby of the Municipal Building for your old or worn flags. Our soldiers from the VFW pick them up for proper

disposal. Show your patriotism and join us in displaying the flag every day. We also thank all of our soldiers, retired and active duty for their service and sacrifices defending our freedoms. We are proud of our hometown heroes. God Bless America!

#### PARKS AND RECREATION

Deptford Township is pleased to announce the opening of new recreation facilities and exercise equipment at Deptford Central Park (formally Fasola Park). The additions include six new pickleball courts, two new tennis courts and a new outdoor fitness circuit.

Aside from the obvious benefit of a free workout, exercising outdoors has numerous health benefits that you cannot find exercising indoors. When you take your workout outside, you put yourself in a position to boost your mental health, challenge your body in new ways, relieve stress, burn more calories and breather cleaner, healthier air.

"The new pickleball courts and fitness circuit are excellent additions to this park," says Mayor Paul Medany. "We're proud of our Township Parks and the opportunities they provide for Deptford Township residents to enjoy the outdoors. We hope that these new additions at Deptford Central Park will bring even more residents out to our parks."

Additionally, Allen Park located on Mail Avenue will also be getting two new Pickleball Courts and a makeover to their Basketball Courts this year.

#### PICKLEBALL COURTS

One of the fastest-growing sports in the United States, pickleball was created in 1965 and combines many of the elements of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong. The six new pickleball courts in Deptford Central Park were created from two former tennis courts. The courts open at sunrise and close at dusk.

The new pickleball courts are part of a larger renovation at Deptford Central Park, which is the largest developed park in the Deptford Township Park System. The renovations also include a new restroom facility structure and additional playground equipment.

#### **FITNESS CIRCUIT**

The new fitness course includes an 8-station outdoor circuit of exercise equipment. Visitors to the park can choose from a stationary bicycle or elliptical trainer for a cardio workout, a sit-up bench or pull-up bar for strength training, or the cargo climber or high stepper for agility. The fitness circuit is equipped with rubber safety surfacing to cushion the impact of any workout.

Deptford Central Park and the fitness circuit are open from sunrise to sunset.

#### **BRANCH REMOVAL**

Ordinance 0.11.12, Titled Branches and Logs. Please adhere to the ordinance to allow us to maintain the regular pick-up schedule.



- Branches must be able to fit in the yard waste containers
- Branches that cannot fit must be cut into 5' lengths and stacked neatly at the curbline.
  - All stumps and logs should be free of dirt and debris and cut to 24".

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

The Township of Deptford needs the help of its citizens to efficiently remove snow and ice from the roadways. We need everyone to keep all vehicles off the street. This includes all registered vehicles and trailers. We intend to plow curb to curb when possible. We have over 500 roads to plow locally and we need 100% cooperation. The following describes the Township's method of snow removal and what you can do to help.

- The main roadways (those that carry the most traffic) are given first priority for salting and plowing.

  During a heavy snowfall, concentration is placed on the main roadways until they are cleared at which time the secondary roads are attended to.


  Cul-de-sacs, or circles, are the last to be plowed.
- Cul-de-sacs are among the most difficult streets to plow and require the greatest amount of time.

  The Public Works department prefers to push the snow off the road leaving the cul-de-sac free from snow piles that could melt and cause icing conditions. This greatly reduces hazardous conditions and prevents pot holes from forming.
- The Public Works department trucks plow as close to the curb-line as possible.

  This creates a wider roadway for travel and parking. During heavier snowfalls, there are times when snow may get pushed into already cleared driveways and sidewalks. Following the diagram below when shoveling your driveway will help avoid the driveway getting closed during plowing.
- The snow that is in front of a plow will unload whenever it passes a clear area.

  Providing a clear area on the side of the driveway where the plow will be traveling, will allow the snow to unload in the clearing before your driveway instead of in your driveway.
- Cars parked on the street become a major problem during inclement winter weather.

  As the plow goes around the parked vehicles, it leaves piles of snow on the roadway. To avoid this, please remove vehicles from the street during snowstorms, in accordance with Township Ordinance.
- Please avoid driving when it is not absolutely necessary during snow plowing operations. Snow plowing, that is normally a routine function, becomes difficult with stalled, stuck or parked cars in the street.

- Please remember to keep leaves away from vehicles and not to park on leaf piles so leaf machines will have easy access to the leaves. Leaves must be placed at the curb free of any rocks, branches, twigs, dirt, pet waste, horse manure or other debris in order for them to be vacuumed up easily and not cause damage to machines.
- Leaves not put to the curb for pickup during this scheduled leaf pickup will have to wait until the beginning of the Fall Clean Up Program or placed in containers and picked up as part of our Yard Waste Program.
- Please note that our Yard Waste Pickup Program runs all year. Yard waste debris such as grass, flowers, plants, small limbs, and "leaves" are required to be placed in containers or biodegradable paper bags at the curb for pickup.
- Loose leaves placed at the curb, instead of in cans, will only be collected during our scheduled leaf collection programs.

#### **REMINDER**

**ZONES:** As noted below, each "Zone" includes several areas & developments, each with varying amounts of leaves. We will be in each zone three (3) times. Each zone will be completed before moving to the next zone. Every effort should be made to have leaves at curbside before the first day of each scheduled visit to ensure timely pickup. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

**Zone 1:** Blackwood Terrace, Almonesson, Garden City, Sunset Park, Hunter's Gate, Willow Ridge, Woodmere Mews, Heritage Woods, Valley Green Estates. Boundary Limits: Almonesson Road, Rt. 41, Clements Bridge Road, Bull Run Creek and all adjoining residential streets.

**Zone 2:** Westville Grove, Westville Oaks, North Woodbury, Woodbury Gardens, Locust Grove, Blanchard's Landing, Ladd's Landing, Heritage Development, Patriots Ridge. Boundary Limits: Deptford Avenue, Delsea Drive (Rt.47), Cedar Avenue, Old Broadway & all adjoining residential streets.

**Zone 3:** Oak Valley, Pine Acres, Mantua Terrace. Boundary Limits: Route 45, Deptford/West Deptford borderline to Jersey Avenue, Woodbury Heights Boundary Line.

**Zone 4:** Deptford Leas, Bexhill Farms, Windemere, Stonybrook Homes, Gardenville center, Cooper Village, Almolind Homes, Woodbrook. Boundary Limits: Fox Run Road, Delsea Drive (Rt. 47), Almonesson Road, NJ Turnpike and all adjoining residential streets.

**Zone 5:** Hammond Heights, Jericho, Deptford Terrace, New Sharon, Lake Tract, Narraticon, Barlow Tract, Country Club Estates, East Woodbury, Lakebridge, Brookmill Homes, Sage Hill. Boundary Limits: Delsea Drive (Rt. 47) - Cooper Street, Glassboro Road, Tanyard Road, Cattell Road, Highland Avenue and all adjoining residential streets.

Please review the breakdown listed below to assist you in determining where your tax dollars are appropriated.



#### WELCOME TO THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

The Tax Collector's office is responsible for the billing and collection of all property taxes. Your tax bill includes the funds for the County, County Open Spaces, School District, Fire District, Municipal, and Municipal Open Space.

Tax bills are to be given to new owner upon the sale of the property. (NJ 54:4-64) Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the owner from paying property taxes and interest will be applied to all late payments. Bills are mailed out annually in July.

#### AFTER HOUR PAYMENTS

After hour payments can be made by placing payment in the citizens drop box located outside main entrance. Please do not leave cash payments in the mail box. Reference your block and lot on your check to ensure proper processing.

#### TAX PAYMENT DUE DATE AND INTEREST

Taxes are due and payable on the 1st day of February, May, August and November. Deptford Township allows a ten day grace period, if payments made after grace period, interest starts to accrue back to the 1st day of the due date month.

Interest on late payments is calculated at a rate of 8% for the first \$1500 delinquent and all amounts over are calculated at 18%. There is a 6% year end penalty if delinquent taxes are over \$10,000 as of December 31st of current year.

#### **TAX SALE**

Tax sale is held once a year. If a property has prior year(s) delinquency in taxes, water, sewer or Property maintenance, the property will go to Tax Sale if not paid on or before the tax sale start time. Tax sale will be advertised in a local paper, four consecutive weeks before tax sale date and posted in five (5) places within the Township of Deptford.

#### **DEDUCTIONS ON PROPERTY TAX**

A \$250 deduction is available on property taxes for any qualifying Senior, Disabled Person, Surviving Spouse of Senior or Disabled Person, Veteran and Widow of Veteran. Applications are available in the Tax Collectors Office or Gloucester County Tax Assessor's Office. For further detail on qualifications please contact the Gloucester County Tax Assessor's Office at (856) 307-6445.

To receive a deduction on your water/sewer, you must qualify for the deduction on your taxes. For further information on water/sewer deductions, call the Deptford Township Municipal Utilities Authority at (856) 415-1111.
