Township Council works diligently to provide the best in municipal services. Over the last two years, Deptford Township has earned numerous awards and proclamations in recognition of our dedication to our community:

- 1) First place in the New Jersey State Municipal Public Information contest. This award recognized our efforts to get you current information on all aspects of our local government, from budget information to events, services and much more.
- 2) New Jersey State Planning Officials Achievement in Planning Award for our purchase and rehabilitation of the Deptford Community Center. This property, formerly a Catholic Church and school, was repurposed into a multi-use facility, which now includes:
- A performing arts center, home to Deptford Theatrical Productions.
- A gymnasium with much needed space for our numerous recreation programs.
- Classrooms packed with everything from art classes, karate lessons for kids, EMT training, our emergency operations center and so much more.

- 3) "We Value our Veterans" award. This prestigious award is given by the NJ State Governor and NJ State Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, recognizing our efforts to assist and aid our military veterans in all aspects. These efforts are evident in initiatives such as our pickleball tournament in September, which saw over \$3,000 raised and donated to our veterans committee.
- 4) NJ State League of Municipalities Leadership Award. This recognizes our efforts in such areas as developing state legislative issues, continuing education courses, published in the NJ League of Municipalities Magazine, and other efforts to promote local government.
- 5) SWANA Solid Waste Association of North America for our partnership with Transtech Industries in reclaiming the Kinsley landfill. This property is now known as an environmental resource center, one of the first designations on the east coast. It includes the operation of capping the landfill, reclaiming the waste gas and constructing what is one of the largest solar panel arrays on the east coast.





SNOW REMOVAL


The Township of Deptford needs the help of its citizens to efficiently remove snow and ice from the roadways. We need everyone to keep all vehicles off the street. This includes all registered vehicles and trailers. We intend to plow curb to curb when possible. We have over 500 roads to plow locally and we need 100% cooperation. The following describes the Township's method of snow removal and what you can do to help.

- The main roadways (those that carry the most traffic) are given first priority for salting and plowing.
- During a heavy snowfall, concentration is placed on the main roadways until they are cleared at which time the secondary roads are attended to. Cul-de-sacs, or circles, are the last to be plowed.
- Cul-de-sacs are among the most difficult streets to plow and require the greatest amount of time.

The Public Works department prefers to push the snow off the road leaving the cul-de-sac free from snow piles that could melt and cause icing conditions. This greatly reduces hazardous conditions and prevents pot holes from forming.

- The Public Works department trucks plow as close to the curb-line as possible.
- This creates a wider roadway for travel and parking. During heavier snowfalls, there are times when snow may get pushed into already cleared driveways and sidewalks. Following the diagram below when shoveling your driveway will help avoid the driveway getting closed during plowing.
- The snow that is in front of a plow will unload whenever it passes a clear area.

 Providing a clear area on the side of the driveway where the plow will be traveling, will allow the
- snow to unload in the clearing before your driveway instead of in your driveway.
- Cars parked on the street become a major problem during inclement winter weather.
 As the plow goes around the parked vehicles, it leaves piles of snow on the roadway. To avoid this, please remove vehicles from the street during snowstorms, in accordance with Township Ordinance.
- Please avoid driving when it is not absolutely necessary during snow plowing operations. Snow plowing, that is normally a routine function, becomes difficult with stalled, stuck or parked cars in the street.



PLEASE DO NOT THROW SNOW INTO THE STREET FROM YOUR SIDEWALK AND DRIVEWAY

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS FOR SENIORS

Protect Your Money

- If you receive checks in the mail regularly, arrange for them to be sent directly to the bank.
- Do not display large amounts of cash.
- Do not sign a check or contract until you are sure it is for a legitimate reason. Know the details. If in doubt, check with a friend, a lawyer, or the Deptford Police Department.
- Never put your purse or wallet on a counter while you examine merchandise in a store.
 Similarly, do not leave your purse unattended in a shopping cart while shopping.

Don't be Conned

- According to the American Association of Retired Persons, older citizens are victims of fraudulent schemes far out of proportion to their population number. Keep informed about the latest con schemes in your community by reading the newspaper or by visiting this web site. Be skeptical about any proposal that sounds too good to be true or has to be kept secret. Do not rush into anything. Check it out with friends, lawyers, police the Better Business Bureau, or the state or county consumer affairs department.
- If you are the victim of fraud, call the police immediately. You may be embarrassed because you were tricked, but your information is vital in catching the con artist and preventing others from being victimized.
- Some of the most prevalent con schemes in our area are fraudulent home repair frauds. There are roving groups of "gypsy" repair and service people who take advantage of our seniors. Only use properly licensed and bonded workers with established reputations. Call the Deptford Police Department if you are contacted or approached by someone looking to do repairs to your home.

When You Are Out

- If you must carry a purse, hold it close to your body. Do not dangle it.
- Never carry a wallet in your back pocket. Put it in an inside jacket pocket or front pants pocket.

- Make sure someone knows when you are going out and when you expect to return.
- Avoid dark, deserted routes even if they are the shortest and most convenient.
- Whenever possible, travel with friends. When using public transportation, sit near the driver.
- Do not overburden yourself with packages and groceries that obstruct your view and make it hard to react.
- Have your car or house key in hand as you approach your vehicle or home.
- When you drive, keep doors locked and windows up. Park in well-lit, busy areas. If you have car trouble, be wary of strangers who offer help. Stay in your car and ask them to call a service truck or the police. Only roll the window down a crack and keep the doors locked. If a friend or taxi takes you home, ask the driver to wait until you are safely inside.
- When walking, act calm, confident, and know where you are going. Trust your instincts if you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, leave.

When You Are at Home

- Use deadbolt locks on all exterior doors. Keep your doors locked at all times, even when you are inside.
- Protect windows and sliding glass doors with good locks or other security devices.
- Make your home appear occupied when you go out by using a timer to turn on lights.
- Never let repair or sales people into your home without checking their identification. Call the Deptford Police to verify their identity if you are not sure.
- Install a viewer in your door or doorbell camera and use it.
- Get to know your neighbors, and keep their telephone numbers handy for emergencies.
- Work out a buddy system with a friend to check on each other daily.
- Keep bonds, stock certificates. seldom worn jewelry in a safe deposit box.
- Do not hide extra house keys under a doormat or in other obvious spots. Leave them with a trusted neighbor.




