## WHAT'S NEW AROUND TOWN

### STRIVING TO REDUCE CRIME

Deptford Township is proud to announce a new initiative on fighting crime in our town. An Anti-Crime Partnership Committee has been developed. The Committee consists of twenty people including Mayor and Council, representatives from Deptford Township Police Department, Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office, Deptford School Administration, and members of the community.

As we strive to be more pro-active in keeping our community safe, we are developing partnerships with our businesses to reduce the crime rate in local businesses. Deptford Township grows to 80,000 people daily, which is in large part, due to our thriving business district. The Mayor, members of Council, Township Administration and Police Department Administration are now meeting with our largest retail merchants and apartment complexes on a quarterly basis to allow us to share information and establish methods to reduce the crime in the Township.

Mayor and Council have also recently introduced a new graffiti ordinance. Graffiti is an unattractive and growing problem in communities. Deptford Township is committed to eliminating the graffiti in our community. The goal is to be more aggressive in issuing penalties towards anyone who is found guilty of making graffiti or defacing property in Deptford Township.

### THE GREENER SIDE OF THINGS

Did you know that you can directly lower costs and; therefore, help control our property taxes with some of these **GREEN** actions:

- ◆ Recycle faithfully. Keep recyclable materials out of the trash stream and reduce disposal fees.
- ◆ Save money and time. Cut it and leave it. Save 20–25% of your time because you won't have to stop and empty the lawnmower bag. You'll also avoid purchasing yard waste bags and hauling them to the curb. You'll need to fertilize less since clippings return nutrients to the soil.
- ◆ Don't fertilize too much. For a healthier lawn, fertilize only twice per year—September and November, using a "slow release" fertilizer.
- ◆ Use the right amount of water. Water lawn in the early morning. This prevents evaporation. Only water your lawn once or twice per week.
- ◆ Mow correctly. For a healthier looking lawn, mow frequently and only remove 1/3 of the lawn height. Most lawns in NJ should be 2 1/2" to 3 1/2" high. This will increase shade to the soil and keep the roots cool while blocking weed growth.
- ◆ Consider mulching your grass clippings. There is a considerable yearly fee for disposal and collection of yard waste. By mulching lawn clippings we can save money while being environmentally friendly.

## A Message from Our Mayor

Municipalities are continuously under tight budget restraints. Many mandates are forced onto municipalities with very limited or no funding at all. I, along with other Mayors from the Gloucester County Mayor's Association, have joined forces to express our concerns with our State government officials regarding the State mandates. Examples of the mandates include COAH (Council on Affordable Housing) and Stormwater Management Program.

Over the last few months, Township employees have participated in training in areas such as management and customer service. In our efforts to better serve our residents, Deptford Township is implementing many of the skills we've acquired at the training to show our commitment to the

community. We've even restructured our dress code to promote a more professional atmosphere. As we recognize the need for our employees to have a casual day, we've instituted an optional "Casual Friday," where employees can donate \$1.00 per week to dress in casual attire on Fridays. All money will be donated to the Gloucester County United Way. Each Friday that you see an employee dressed in jeans, you'll know that Deptford Township is contributing to the United Way. Additionally, our employees continue to receive training in GCOP (Gloucester County on Patrol). GCOP program enables employees to recognize problems in the community and how to resolve them effectively.

Deptford Township recognizes the impact that volunteers play in our athletic programs. We were

one of the first municipalities to create a Local Code of Conduct Ordinance. The main goal of the ordinance is to encourage the community to exhibit proper, sportsmanship behavior at all of our sporting events. The Township requires all coaches and assistants to successfully complete the Rutgers Safety Clinic class. The class is offered multiple times throughout the year at the Municipal Building. Both the Local Code of Conduct Ordinance and the Rutgers Safety Clinic were implemented to protect our volunteers and league officials.

## THINK SAFETY REMINDER !!!

Effective April 1, 2006, permits are now required for the soft wall (storable) type pools as follows:

*If the pool is capable of holding twenty-four or more inches of water, a Zoning Permit will be required for each year. A Building Permit will also be required for the installation of a permanent barrier that the Building Code mandates. An electrical permit will NOT be required as long as there is a GFCI receptacle within twenty-five feet of the pool.*

*Zoning Permits are **REQUIRED** annually.*

*Please note **NO** pools will be grandfathered.*

## CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT TANK REMOVAL

Permits are required for removal/abandonment of residential heating oil tanks and other heating oil tanks under 2,001 gallons. You must follow the guidelines set forth in Bulletin No. 95-1B of the New Jersey Uniform Construction Code. It is suggested that all residents use the services of a professional for tank removal.

#### Aboveground Tank Removal

1. Remove oil from tank.
2. Cut oil tank in half by removing top.
3. Remove sludge after squeegeeing.
4. Hand-wipe inside of tank clean.
5. Remove tank (and fill and vent pipes, if separate) and dispose at proper facility (most scrap metal yards will accept cleaned storage tanks).
6. Dispose of all sludge, water, etc. a licensed facility. Have oil reclaimed or dispose of it at a licensed facility.

#### Underground Tank Removal

1. Remove oil from tank.
2. Excavate tank.
3. Cut adequate size hole in tank to permit cleaning.
4. Enter and squeegee tank.
5. Remove sludge.
6. Hand-wipe inside of tank clean.
7. Remove tank (and fill and vent pipes, if separate).
8. Check tank for visual leaks and determine if there is contaminated soil.
9. Backfill hole. Inspection required prior to backfilling.
10. Dispose of all sludge, water, etc.. at a licensed facility. Have oil reclaimed or dispose of at a licensed facility.

#### Collection Guidelines

- ◆ Branches should be cut into 5 foot sections and be neatly placed at the curbline.
- ◆ Logs should be cut into 2 foot sections and be placed neatly at curbline.
- ◆ Tree roots and stumps must be free of dirt and cut into 2 foot sections for easy handling.

### YARD WASTE

Deptford Township's yard waste is a year-round program, residents can place their grass clipping, sticks, twigs, small bundles of branches and garden clippings in a container no larger than 30 gallons and cannot exceed 50 lbs. in weight.

#### NOTES:

- Dirt, rocks, sod, and pet waste will **not** be accepted in these containers.
- Yard waste placed in plastic bags will **not** be accepted.
- Yard waste will be picked up following your regular trash collection day.

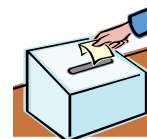

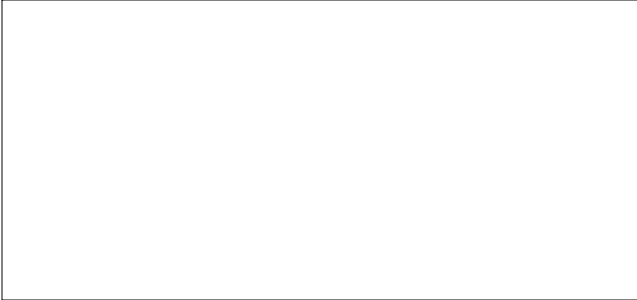
