DEPTFORD TOWNSHIP ON PATROL

Deptford Township is a reflection of the many hard working municipal employees who come to work here each day. They understand their efforts help ensure our municipal services run smoothly and contribute to the greater good. Nowhere is this more important than in ensuring public safety.

Following 9/11, government at all levels recognized the important role we can all play in safeguarding our communities. If you see something, say something is now a national campaign started by the Dept. of Homeland Security that raises public awareness of the indicators of terrorism and terrorism-related crime as well as the importance of reporting suspicious activity to state and local law enforcement.

In furtherance of these important goals, Deptford Township is proud to announce the Deptford Township on Patrol (DTOP) program.

DTOP is an innovative community policing plan training municipal employees already on our streets how to recognize and report crime and suspicious activity to our fine Deptford Police Department as well as other critical incidents to Fire and Emergency Medical personnel. These trained employees having day to day contact with Deptford residents will become extra eyes and ears for our police department. The police can then determine whether the information warrants investigation.

Time is our most precious commodity. When suspicious activity is reported can be instrumental in saving a life or a perpetrator arrested. Employees will learn when to call 911 for an emergent situation and when to report suspicious non-emergent behavior to the police. Knowing the difference can shave seconds off the response time and have a positive impact on the outcome.

The municipal vehicles of trained employees will have the DTOP decal so residents in need of emergency services can flag them down and report their problem. All DTOP vehicles will have radio and/or phone services to help residents report their problem. Employees will be empowered to become community caretakers in the truest sense.

Importantly, employees will learn the questions that will be asked by police or county dispatch when they report suspicious activity or a crime so that they will know in advance how to describe a person's behavior, car or home. The DTOP program will respect a resident's privacy as well as their civil rights. It will focus on behavior-not how one looks. Employees will be trained to understand a person's race, ethnicity and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious.

Deptford Township is a leader in providing a wide array of diverse services for residents from a vibrant shopping district to excellent parks and playgrounds enjoyed year round. We are constantly looking for new ways to improve public safety. 'DEPEND ON DEPTFORD': FIRE DEPARTMENT SEEKS VOLUNTEERS THROUGH NEW CAMPAIGN

Deptford Fire Department has launched a campaign to recruit new volunteers to its ranks and spread awareness of the department's important role in the community. Details can be found at www.deptfordfd.org.

The department is looking for volunteers to serve in a variety of roles, including:

- Administrative duties

Teenagers ages 16 and 17 can volunteer, too. As junior firefighters, they develop the skills necessary to become a full-fledged firefighter while assisting on calls and at the station.

The fire department was formed in 1966 from the merger of eight individual volunteer companies. Seven of those companies are still active, grouped into four battalions: Oak Valley, Tacoma, Helping Hand, Union (Blackwood Terrace), Almonesson Lake, New Sharon, and Community (Lake Tract). A fifth battalion is comprised of career staff.
